



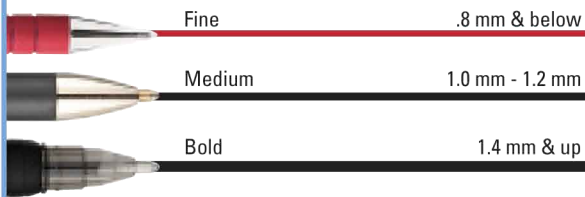
BUYING GUIDE Pens and Ink

- Bold for the most vivid marking.
- Pens that prevent check washing.

- Earth-friendly choices.

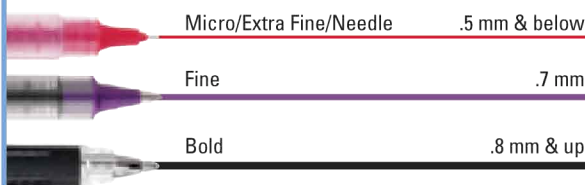
BALLPOINT PENS



BALLPOINT INK

- Quick-drying ink – Great for left-handers.
- Perfect for writing through carbon copies.
- Writes with precise lines.
- Less smearing than roller ball and gel inks.
- Typically offers extended write life.

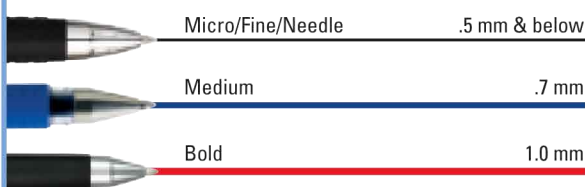
ROLLER BALL PENS



ROLLER BALL INK

- Fluid ink takes very little effort to make the ink flow.
- Longer drying time than ballpoint.
- Provides bright, vibrant, rich coloring on your page.
- Juicy ink lay down.

GEL PENS



GEL INK

- Combines qualities of ballpoint and roller ball pen.
- In an idle state, ink is thick, similar to a ballpoint.
- Once the ball begins rolling, provides a fluid writing experience like a roller ball.
- Provides bright, vibrant, rich coloring on your page.
